**2022 JUDICIAL PERFORMANCE EVALUATION STATISTICAL REPORT**  
*Pursuant to §13-5.5-114(1), C.R.S. (2017)*

Of the 164 judicial officers eligible to stand for retention in 2022, 140 were evaluated by State and District Commissions. One hundred and thirty-five (135) judicial officers declared their intent to stand for retention and will appear on the ballot in 2022. (See Table A for a breakdown by judge type.) Commissions evaluated five additional judges not standing for retention.

State and District Commissions determined 135 (100%) judicial officers met performance standards.

\*Judges are first appointed by the Governor to serve a provisional term of office of at least two years before appearing on the ballot for retention. If retained, they next appear on the ballot after having served a regular term of office.
